On June 23, 2015, Shareholders of Informatica Corporation (INFA) voted concerning the proposed merger with a wholly-owned subsidiary of Italics Inc., both affiliated with certain funds advised by Permira Advisers LLC and Canada Pension Plan Investment Board. The merger was approved and subsequently consummated on August 6, 2015. As a result, each existing INFA Common Share will be converted into the right to receive \$48.75 net cash per share.

CONTRACT ADJUSTMENT

NEW DELIVERABLE

PER CONTRACT: \$4,875.00 Cash (\$48.75 x 100)

Settlement in INFA options will take place through OCC's cash settlement system. Settlement will be accomplished by payment of the difference between the extended strike amount and the cash deliverable.

ACCELERATION OF EXPIRATIONS

Pursuant to OCC Rule 807, equity stock option contracts whose deliverables are adjusted to call for cashonly delivery will be subject to an acceleration of the expiration dates for outstanding option series. (See OCC Information Memo 23707) Additionally, the exercise by exception (ex by ex) threshold for expiring series will be \$.01 in all account types.

All series of Informatica Corporation options whose expiration dates are after 8-21-2015 will have their expiration dates advanced to 8-21-2015. Expiration dates occurring before 8-21-2015 (e.g., Flex options) will remain unchanged.

All Informatica Corporation options will utilize a \$.01 exercise threshold.

Option Symbol: INFA

Existing Expiration: All months New expiration date: 8-21-2015

Existing American-style Informatica Corporation options remain exercisable at the option of the holder prior to their expiration. Exercised options will continue to settle in three business days.
